Eight staff members along with Dr. Sutton and Dr. Jenifer met for coffee. Dr. Jenifer explained that he liked to meet with staff in a small setting to prevent any miscommunications. He then had everyone introduce themselves and tell what he/she did for the university.

The President said this was a difficult year due to financial cutbacks but he felt these cutbacks would only require some fine tuning of the budgets. He also felt that the state still had some options which would help in the long term.

Dr. Jenifer spoke about some goals he felt were obtainable including: merit based raises, retirees privileges and better signage. He also wants to remind staff that U.T. Dallas is selling a product (education), and as good salespeople we need to continue our friendly service to our customers.

Dr. Jenifer then asked about our concerns and received several suggestions and comments from the group.

Assistant Chief Marable explained their rganizational structure and emphasized that y are a full-fledged police department with ly trained personnel. Each officer comf training at one of the top three academies

in Texas. Their training includes: firearms, criminal investigations, first aid, traffic law, Texas penal code, and arrest procedures.

She detailed the many services offered to the campus community. These include: walking escorts, battery jump assistance, criminal investigations, lost & found, emergency call boxes, vehicle unlocks on manual doors only, lock-out assist for offices, maps & temporary parking passes at the information center, and valuable property engraving.

The UTD Police Department has: county-wide jurisdiction, a Special Response Team, an Explorers sponsorship, and undercover officers.

Chief Ridge reminded us that faculty and staff must notify the police department in advance and in writing to request after hours access to secured areas.

Chief Ridge explained the role of the Parking and Security Committee and stated that the committee sets the parking rules. The committee members respond to appeals via email (average response time is 2 hours). The appeal procedures are detailed on the web at http://www.utdallas.edu/parking.

Annual General Compliance Training

It is once again time to begin UTD's annual General Compliance Training. All benefit eligible employees (employed at least 50% time, for more than 4 1/2 months) are required to complete training. Soon you will receive an email advising you of your assigned training modules, and giving you instructions for logging onto the web-based training system—the Training Post. Please note that all training must be completed by April 30, 2003.

This year, new employees will be assigned a list of required modules, and must complete their training within the first 30 days of employment. In order to accommodate new employees, the Training Post will be up year-round.

In conjunction with the general compliance training modules, there are nine job-specific training modules in the Training Post. They are:

- ARP-ATP Principle Investigator Training
- Cash Handling
- Form I-9: Verifying Employee Work Eligibility
- Human Subjects in Research
- Petty Cash Funds
- Property Inventory
- Purchasing Cardholder Training
- Purchasing Cardholder Training (supervisors)
- Texas Hazard Communication Act

You may be assigned a job-specific module depending on your duties. For example, if you are a petty cash custodian, possess a UTD purchasing card, conduct equipment inventory for your department, etc.; you will be required to complete the appropriate additional training module(s).

SAFETY TIP

Something all Texans should know, Texas Department of Public Safety Roadside Assistance Hotline is for motorists to contact for non-emergency roadside assistance. When a call is received, DPS notifies the appropriate local police agency or DPS office. Examples of when to call the hotline include: stranded with car problems, hazardous road conditions, debris in the roadway, suspicious activity at a rest area, and obviously intoxicated or dangerous drivers. In an emergency, 911 is still the first number to call. The number is on the back of your driver's licenses, just above the barcode, 1-800-525-5555. Some information to have ready when you call: name, vehicle description, cell phone number, highway mile marker, and city/county location.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS

The President's Cabinet is scheduled to review and adopt a revised criminal background check policy this spring. Once a revised policy is adopted, it will be posted on the Business Affairs policy web site.

STAFF EDUCATION BENEFIT

The University of Texas at Dallas offers eligible employees the opportunity to register for up to six hours of regular academic credit per semester and receive a waiver of incidental fees. The benefit does NOT include the waiver of legislatively enacted fees (Student Services Fee, Student Union Fee, Recreational Facility Fee, Medical Services Fee, International Education Fee, etc.) or course fees, such as lab fees, field trip fees, etc.

The education benefit program was implemented in 2002, with 62 waivers being issued (18 - Spring 2002, 15 - Summer 2002, and 29 - Fall 2002). If you are a student and haven't taken advantage of this benefit, you should. It will save you money.
