NO HMO BLUE

We have been advised by UT System Administration that 2005-2006 may be the last year an HMO (HMO Blue in North Texas) is an option. Each year as health care costs increase and the legislative mandates for HMOs increase. it has become more difficult to find an HMO to provide the services the UT System requires for its employees and retirees at an affordable cost. If the health care market makes it cost prohibitive to offer an HMO option in the UT plan in 2006-2007, or at any time in the future, the System is committed to working with current HMO members to ease their transition into the UT Select plan. Recycling At UTD:

In response to a suggestion that UTD start a plastic bottle recycling program, Physical Plant Director, Del Overstreet, provided the Staff Council with the following information.

Currently, we recycle paper and aluminum cans. The recycling program began in January 1993. Presently, UTD has spent approximately \$540,000.00 in labor, materials, and equipment. The income produced from the program is roughly \$30,500.00. The money is being put into a scholarship fund.

A major problem with recycling plastic bottles is the high volume and low density of the bottles, which makes the logistics of collection, stockpiling, and disposal very difficult and expensive. Therefore it is not feasible to integrate plastic bottle recycling with our paper and aluminum can program."

The Staff Council collects used computer ink cartridges for recycling. Approximatly \$2,000.00 has been raised for the staff scholaarship fund
