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JOIN UTD'S COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

Would you be ready to respond to a disaster, rather than react to it? Would you know what to do if an accident or fire occurs?

The UTD Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) educates staff, faculty, and students about disaster preparedness and can train you in basic disaster response skills.

In the event of an emergency, you can be a first responder, coordinating and providing leadership before professional responders arrive.

Every CERT member is trained in:

- Light search and rescue
- Basic first aid
- Disaster medical procedure
- Fighting small fires
- Terrorism and disaster psychology

The CERT training for community groups is usually delivered in two 1/2 hour sessions, one day a week, over a 7 week period.

At the end of the training, you will be given an opportunity to test your knowledge in a disaster simulation exercise.

After successfully completing a simulation, you will become a member of the UTD CERT Program.

The CERT program is supported by the U.S.

Department of Homeland Security and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Do not place personal information such as your Social Security Number, date of birth or driver's license number on your checks.

Do not provide personal, financial or other identifying information to an unknown telephone caller.

Before revealing personal information to anyone, ask how it will be used.

Use your Social Security Number only

Before furnishing any information online ensure the website is securely protected and starts with https://.

Obtain a free credit report from www.annualcreditreport.com once a year to review it for errors.

NEW UTD ID WILL REPLACE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

This number will replace your Social Security Number as your primary ID number for everything from employment, to library usage, to registering for a class.

COFFEE WITH THE PRESIDENT

The coffees with the President have been very popular and successful!

The first coffee in February brought Staff Council members from Districts 2 and 5 to meet with President Daniel. The second coffee, in April, was with Districts 3 and 4. The conversations and questions were well received by the president.

He spoke about several projects in the works, such as campus beautification, where a search is underway to find a world-renown landscape architect to create a unified look for the university.

Another priority is recruiting and enrolling prospective students which involves telling our story better: how UTD is becoming a top-tier research university, advantageously located within DFW near some of the world's major companies.

Participants were unanimous in their gratitude for the upgrades and beautification of the campus. There were many comments about how attractive the grounds appeared and praise for repairs of sidewalks and buildings that posed safety concerns.

Other matters that were mentioned included comments about how important a strong Arts and Humanities program is to a world-class university; the popularity of a DART rail station across from the campus; locations and conditions of parking lots; better signage around campus; and the possible location of a Student Services building.

The next coffees will be in June with District 1 and 7 and in August with District 6.
