In Memoriam: Dr. Larry D. Terry

Respected administrator, renowned scholar and friend to many

Dr. Larry D. Terry, Vice President for Business Affairs, passed away on Saturday, June 17 at the age of 52. His death occurred in Atlanta, while on universityrelated business.

Dr. Terry joined UTD in 2001 as a professor of Public Administration. He was an acclaimed author. international authority in public administration and a member of the National Academy of Public Adminis-



tration. In recent years, he served as editor of the prestigious scholarly journal Public Administration Review.

Under his leadership as Vice President for Business Affairs, the university launched an ambitious effort to upgrade campus facilities, making them safer, more

> efficient and more attractive. Improvements to the campus mall, renovations to classrooms and other buildings and the expansion of the campus police force were among Dr. Terry's many accomplishments.

The university has opened a scholarship fund to recognize Dr. Terry. Donations should be sent to:

UTD ID is Here

In early July, you were issued a new eightdigit UTD identification number that replaces your Social Security number as your primary identifying number. This new number identifies your records in the Human Resources and Payroll system and can be used for everything from employment, to library usage, to registering for a class.

In October, you can replace your old Comet Card with new a one that displays your UTD-ID number. Your Social Security number will still be used for tax purposes and certain federal forms, but will no longer be your main identifier.

Need to check on your retirement program beneficiary? Teacher Retirement System participants should call I-800-223-8778. Optional Retirement Program participants should contact your individual carriers.

Feel better about saving UT Select members have access to a

dynamic new tool. Using *Savings Advisor* members can identify potential cost-saving prescription drug alternatives or use the site to check prescription drug cost.

To access this tool, set up an online account on www.medco.com. Once logged in, Savings Advisor is listed on the left-side under Planning and Reference. On the Savings Advisor page, you can select medications and compare drug costs.

A less taxing option Soon you will have the option of investing in a Roth 403(b). This new option provides another retirement savings opportunity. A Roth 403(b) allows participants to set aside after-tax retirement funds.

The program coordinates pre-tax deposits and after-tax deposits under the IRS 403(b) code. You can choose after-tax contributions, pre-tax contributions or a combination of the two. More information to come in the fall.

Go paperless The UT Retirement Manager (UTRM) is a secure online retirement enrollment site where you can:

- Explore U.T. System retirement plans
- View summaries of your retirement plan balances (from approved vendors)
- Enroll in and make changes to your retirement plans and split your contributions between multiple vendor
- Read financial education articles about financial planning.
- Use financial calculators to help you determine how much of your salary you may need to save for your future.

WAYS TO LIVE HEALTHIER LIVES

What simple preventive measures would help us live healthier, longer lives? The Partnership for Prevention came up the following tips.

Daily aspirin to reduce the risk of heart attacks and stroke in women older than 50 and men over 40.

Screen for colorectal cancer among adults 50 and older.

Check blood pressure in all adults, and treat with hypertension drugs if needed.

Annual flu shots for adults over 50.

Cervical-cancer screening for sexually active women over 21.

Cholesterol testing for men 35 and older and women 45 and older.

Routine breast-cancer screening for women 50 and older. Women ages 40-49 should discuss screening options with their doctor.

Folic acid supplements for women planning to become pregnant.

Child-safety measures such as car seats, stair guards, poison control, pool fences, bicycle helmets.

Diabetes screening for adults with high cholesterol or high blood pressure.

Annual enrollment is underway

The annual enrollment period ends July 31. If you have changes to your retirement, medical, dental, or other benefits, now's the time. Here are some important notices and tips.

This is the last year that HMO Blue will be offered. If you are a current HMO Blue member and you want to remain in HMO Blue for plan year 2006-2007, you must log on to UT Touch and re-elect your coverage. Visit http://utdirect.utexas.edu/uttouch.

Coverage Option Letters (PIN letters) were emailed on July 1 to your campus email. Login to UT Touch during July 2006 to make changes.

If you wish to enroll or re-enroll in UT Flex, you must login to UT Touch to make your election. This year, you are electing an annual amount, not a monthly amount. If you are a UT Select member and do not want to make any changes, you do not have to login (except for those electing UT Flex).
