year project with JAK Films?

JAK Films, Inc., formed in 1994 by George Lucas to produce the final three episodes of Star Wars, contacted Special Collections in August 2005 requesting WWI moving and still images for a DVD series they were producing titled The Adventures of Young Indiana Jones. They requested moving and still images of Manfred von Richthofen (the Red Baron). Anthony Fokker, and the Lafayette Escadrille. These images were used in companion documentaries for Episode 12: Attack of the Hawkmen.



Recently, Special Collections received copies of the segments in which their materials were used. These copies are available to anyone who wishes to view them. The first volume of the series was released October 23, 2007. It should also be noted that UTD's Media Services participated in the project by converting VHS video tape to a broadcast-quality format.

UT Dallas goes into Space

A UT Dallas flag flew with astronaut Jim Reilly, a UT Dallas alumnus, to the International Space Station this summer. Mr Reilly gave to the UT Dallas students, staff and faculty a framed collage of the crew, crew patch and a small Texas flag that flew with Reilly to the International Space Station.

The inscription in the framed collage reads, "This Texas state flag and accompanying UT Dallas banner were flown aboard the United States Space Shuttle Atlantis during STS-117, which launched June 8, 2007, and landed June 22, 2007, for a mission duration of 13 days, 20 hours, 12 minutes and 44 seconds and 220 orbits covering a total distance of 5,809,363 miles. Presented to the Faculty, Staff and Students of the University of Texas at Dallas, where the uncompromising search for academic excellence provides students the ability to reach past their expectations.
