Free Transportation on DART

The UT Dallas Transportation Services Office was established in the Fall semester of 2007. The mission of Transportation Services is to provide onand off-campus transit to students, faculty, staff, and visitors that is convenient, cost effective, and safe.

In cooperation with Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART), Route 883 provides transit service Monday through Friday from the campus to the DART Light Rail system and local residential and shopping areas. Route 883 operates a limited schedule on weekends.

The second route, Route 884, provides round-trip transportation Monday through Friday from the Richardson campus to the Callier Center, UT Southwestern, and the Center for Brain Health.

All transit services operated by the University are open to the public. No pass or ID of any sort is necessary to board and no fare is required. UT Dallas faculty, staff and students are eligible for free transit passes for all of DART's services.

Did you know...

ECS Continues on Growth Path

The latest news from the Jonsson School of Engineering and Computer Science is all about growth.

Research revenue from the past year hit an all-time record, topping \$27 million, and with the arrival of five new electrical engineering faculty last fall the school now has nearly 100 faculty members.

Meantime, space in the one-yearold Natural Science and Engineering Research Laboratory building is reserved for still more new researchers and their students and staff as they're recruited to the school.

In addition, a new department will debut this fall: Materials Science and Engineering. It will be led by Yves Chabal, holder of the Texas Instruments Distinguished University Chair in Nanoelectronics, who joined the school in January from Rutgers University after two decades of distinguished work at Bell Labs. The department will build upon the school's established materials science program that has grown up in the Department of Electrical Engineering.

The Jonsson School also hopes to introduce a mechanical engineering program this fall.

Additional examples of growth are expected in the very near future, thanks to student efforts: The UT Dallas IEEE branch is planning a much-expanded technology expo the week of Feb. 17 in honor of National Engineers Week, for instance. And plans for the Game Engineering Conference in late March envision the largest event ever organized by the student chapter of the Association for Computing Machinery, working in conjunction with the Student Game Developers Association.

Doolittle Tokyo Raiders Coming to UTD

The Doolittle Tokyo Raiders are coming to Dallas to celebrate their 66th Anniversary Reunion of the famous World War II raid on Tokyo, Japan. The raid took place on April 18, 1942 when 16 Army B-25 Mitchell bombers took off from the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Hornet on a mission to bomb Tokyo and other Japanese military and industrial targets. It was the first significant offensive operation against the Japanese.

On April 19 at 1:30p.m. in Conference Center Auditorium, Dr. Larry Sall will give a brief talk about the events leading up to the raid, followed by Col. C. V. Glines who will talk about the mission. Following these brief lectures, the Raiders will be introduced and the audience will be given a chance to ask the Raiders questions. This is a rare opportunity to meet the few remaining men who took part in the raid - men who are true American Heroes. This event is free and open to the public.
